

## Wood Tech Wakas

Room 1 are working on an exciting Wood Tech project to build model Waka Hourua this term.

Having researched the design of this early Maori expedition boat, the children drew design sketches with double canoe style hulls, a deck, shelter, sail and paddles. Using off-cuts of ply wood kindly donated by Mitre 10 and the Ashford's building site, the children have started to learn how to measure, saw and hammer the wood into boat models.

If anyone can lend us any clamps, they would be great to hold the wood more firmly whilst the children saw the pieces.

Next week work will begin on the design for sails, **so if you have an old white or cream pillow case or sheet, please send it in**.

If you would like to join the fun, we'll be working on the boats every Tuesday from 1-2:45pm this term and plan to test them in the river at a later date.
