#### 'Ask an Elder' Interviews and Morning Tea

Room 1 are learning about the history of Garston and working towards their Southland History Heritage Award badges. The children have chosen three aspects of history to research: from family history, to local people, or a local historical site.

To start the historical research, the class decided to hold an event for local older people. A number of local older people were invited to come and talk about their experiences living in Garston over the decades. The children brainstormed 30 questions ranging from: school life, to favourite toys, sports and changes noticed over the years. The interviews have been voice recorded, so that the children can listen to tales of Garston life and write up some answers later.

This week the children have baked four treats from traditional recipes, with the funding and support of the GHS. The Garston School Café was set up so that morning tea could be served to combine the generations and enjoy some tasty treats.


