Rugby Coaching

Room 1 and 2 are fortunate to enjoy the expertise of Southland Rugby's coaches Quinn and Georgia for three sessions this term.

Georgia is working with the younger students to develop: spatial awareness through dodging drills; rugby ball handling skills through run, stop and catch games; and attack and defend skills using the ripper tags. The lessons are quite challenging and the children are building resilience alongside fitness.

Quinn meanwhile, is coaching the older students to develop: spin passing, catching the rugby on the full, punting and grub kicking and spatial awareness. The seniors are playing small-sided games and are developing team-work in larger sided games. Despite a few minor bumps and knocks, the children are really showing enthusiasm for rugby, at a level to engage mixed ages and genders.
