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#### Synopsis of the Board of Trustees meeting held on 30th November 2022.

#### Principal's Report

- \* Heron Futter who works for Healthy Active Learning gave a presentation on the health and physical education programme goals. This included the connections which can be accessed to other agencies throughout Southland who are also working in specific areas of community and personal health promotion. Heron commented on our school's excellent commitment to promoting health and physical education programmes and the quality of resources that we provide to support them.
- \* Discussion around the Board's strategic goals for 2023 in the areas of student achievement, curriculum, systems and governance. These include the retention of current goals for Literacy, Maths, Well-being and Curriculum development.
- \* Induction process for new Board members was discussed.

#### In-committee.

Analysis of school-wide end of year reading, writing and maths data to include: progress and achievement of individuals and cohort groups; support for students' learning (within school and itinerant resource personnel); potential barriers to reading goals and targets; analysis of variance to goals; next steps.

#### Policy and Board assurances.

- \* The following policies were reviewed to include feedback from parents: Alcohol, Drugs and Other Harmful Substances; School Bus Transport; Digital Technology and Cybersafety; Health, Safety and Welfare; Swimming Pool.
- \* Discussion of Assurances of compliance to regulations and outcomes for the following: emergency drills; staff usage and expenditure; bus audit; teacher appointment process; statutory school opening.

#### Employment & Personnel.

Principal outlined systems and actions taken to meet expectations for: staff professional growth cycle; professional learning and development; staffing allocation for 2023; board training undertaken.

#### **Property**

Still waiting for consent to install water, sewerage and drainage for the new classroom block.

#### Health & Safety.

- \* 2 minor injuries were treated on site.
- \* The Flying Fox has passed its annual inspection.
- \* A successful Earthquake Drill was carried out.
- \* Risk Analysis plan for the Kingston Flyer trip was viewed.

#### Legal Compliance

The school roll at the date of the meeting was 31 and made up of 15, (Year 0-3) and 16, (Year 4-7) students.

#### School Bus.

Discussion of audit results and management strategies to ensure our school works with the bus provider (GoBus) to comply wit MOE requirements.

Discussion of 2023 Term 1 swimming programme which will be based at the Mossburn Community pool.

- \* Who is a Christmas tree's favourite singer? Spruce Springsteen!

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
# Prizegiving and Concert
